



TENDER OPPORTUNITIES AT THE 2010 FIFA WORLD CUP LOCAL ORGANISING COMMITTEE (OC)



The 2010 FIFA World Cup Organising Committee South Africa (Association Incorporated Under Section 21) ("OC") is governed by section 21 of the Companies Act, 61 of 1973. The OC was incorporated on 29th August 2005 as an independent non-profit section 21 company charged with the responsibility of organising the FIFA Confederations Cup 2009 and the 2010 FIFA World Cup South Africa™.

The mission statement: "The 2010 FIFA World Cup South Africa™ presents the ideal stage to rally and mobilise the people of South Africa to organise an African FIFA world cup with precision, innovation and flair; to extend an unforgettable South African welcome to the world; to collaborate with all stakeholders in a dynamic partnership based on integrity and excellence."

The 2010 FIFA World Cup Organising Committee South Africa™ (OC) invites interested and suitably qualified service providers to submit Proposals and Information in respect of the following bidding opportunities

RFQ&I: FCC 12 Back-up Power (Diesel Generators) and Uninterrupted Power Supply for FCC 2009

Request for Quotations and Information for the Rental, Installation and Operations of Back-up Power (Diesel Generators) and Uninterrupted Power Supply for FCC 2009

To give effect to the Government guarantees and FIFA requirements for power supply during the Championship, the DME has mandated the OC to procure the back-up power solution. The OC hereby invites interested and capable service providers to submit proposals for the turn-key service / solution to supply, install, operate, decommission and removal of the back-up Diesel Generators and UPS for the FIFA Confederations Cup 2009 championships that will be hosted from 14th June 2009 at Ellis Park (JHB), Mangaung (Bloemfontein), Royal Bafokeng (Rustenburg) and Loftus Versveld (Pretoria/Tshwane) stadia in South Africa. The scope of this project includes:

- The supply, installation and commissioning, of the required back-up and technical power supply diesel generators on a full-maintenance leasing basis to the facilities within the respective stadiums for the FCC 2009 tournament period. This includes all associated civil work such as plinths.
- The design, supply, installation and commissioning of associated synchronization equipment, as well as power- and fuel monitoring systems.
- The supply and storage of fuel and other consumables
- The design, supply and installation of power distribution equipment such as cables, trays, and distribution boards, including all associated civil work.
- The supply and installation of associated earthing system
- The safe handling and transportation of all the abovementioned equipment to and from each stadium and broadcast centre site.
- The commissioning of the entire electrical system supplied including certificates of compliance
- The operation and maintenance of the entire electrical system supplied for the duration of the FCC
- The decommissioning and removal of all the abovementioned equipment.

The OC would prefer to engage with service providers that:

- Have an existing inventory of diesel generators greater than 10MVA, comprising of diesel generators greater than 350kVA each.
- Have a sufficient number of experienced and suitably qualified personnel (project management, engineering, HSE, design, construction, supervision, quality assurance, inspection, project controls etc), available to execute specified size of contract.
- Have proven experience in provision of the abovementioned scope of works.
- Have an ISO 9001:2000 quality management system.
- Are willing to tender and sign a New Engineering Contract (NEC3) contract format.
- Have event (e.g. international sport events such as FIFA, international concerts) related Back-up Power Supply/ Distribution experience including UPS and Fuel management.
- Are familiar and compliant with the National Energy Regulator Act 2004 (Act 40 of 2004)
- Will ensure that the installation will be compliant with Electrical Installations Regulations published under Section 35 of the Machinery and Occupational Safety Act, 1983 (Act 6 of 1983), Safety Standards OHSA Act 1993 (Act 85 of 1993) and National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (107 of 1998)

The OC will therefore invite only the pre-qualified service providers to further participate in the competitive bidding process.**
